It is the language of highland Eritrea, namely the provinces of Hamasien, Akkele Guzay and Serae, Tigray province (Agame, Haramat, Geralta, Tembien, Enderta, Wogerat, Shire, Adiyabo), and the adjoining regions of Gondar Province, Woldebba, and Tsellemti. Tigrinya is not standardized, but is spoken in a number of mutually intelligible dialects.

The 60,000 entries in the dictionary are arranged by root (or if there isn't a root, by the initial letter of the word according to the order of the Ethiopic alphabet, with some exceptions).
